New Faces in Primary 1 with their Buddies




Pictured are the new Primary 1 pupils who have started school yesterday.

Sickness in School

Should your child feel unwell in school, we will contact you to let you know and, if necessary, arrange for collection. It is therefore vitally important that the school has up-to-date contact details for parents- as well as a contact number in case of Emergency. Please contact Majella in the school office if your details have changed.

It is also the policy of our school to make contact with parents should your child receive a bump to the head. It is then left to • parents' own discretion whether the child stays in school or is taken home. Please see notes on Concussion below.

WHAT IS CONCUSSION?

A concussion is a brain injury which is usually caused by hitting your head or a fall. Concussions must be taken seriously. It is important to be able to recognise the signs and know how to respond. SPOT THE SIGNS

If your child has been hit on the head or fallen, you need to look out for signs like these:

A headache

Feeling dazed or confused

Feeling drowsy or sleepy

Feeling sick

Feeling 'irritable' or 'in a fog'

Having difficulty remembering things

Any other change in normal behaviour

Concussion does not always involve losing consciousness; you must take any of these symptoms seriously.

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Please ensure your child brings in their P.E. Kit this week. This kit should be left in school so that P.E. lessons & Afterschool Clubs are not missed when children forget their gear. Children will then be encouraged to bring the kit home half-termly for washing.

As children are involved in P.E. activities both indoors and outdoors (weather permitting), the following items should be available:

School PE Uniform Plain white round neck T-Shirt and navy shorts or School sports kit jersey and school kit shorts Plimsolls or trainers Navy track suit bottoms for outdoors

As part of the school's PE policy, and in the interests of health, safety and hygiene, children are required to change their clothing to participate in PE lessons. Children are reminded that PE uniform (e.g. track suit bottoms) may **not** be worn to school on days when PE is

to take place as the 'changing' policy must be consistently followed. We thank parents for your co-operation with this.


The school adopts a 'Linguistic' approach to the teaching of Phonics. This approach provides children with strategies to help them problemsolve words for both reading and writing.

There are five principles that underpin Linguistic Phonics:

1. Sounds are represented by letters.

- 2. A sound may be presented by one or more letter.
- 3. The same sound can be represented in more than one way.
- 4. Longer words are made up of syllables.
 - The same spelling may represent more than one sound.
